Vital Signs® is coordinated nationally by Community Foundations of Canada.


We are extremely grateful to all who participated. The result is a report that provides a portrait of our community at this moment in time.



Students enrolled at Red River College Winkler Campus Full Time Programs and Continuing Education




RRC Winkler Campus offers 13 different diploma or certificate programs and 77 part time continuing education classes for 2012-2013. They also offer an Adult Learning Centre where students (19 and over) can obtain their grade 12 diploma.

The Winkler and District Chamber of Commerce hosted or participated in hosting 12 learning events in 2011 on a variety of topics including HR Standards. Customer Service and Apprenticeship. These events regularly drew groups of 15-35 people each.

The new Northlands Parkway Collegiate in Winkler will include a child care centre with proposed space for 12 infants, 36 preschool and 30 school age children.

Thanks to the creation of the Dr CWWiebe Fund, \$50,000 was granted for the MRI at BTHC. WCF has also supported local programs facilitated by the Alzheimer's Society, Child and Family Services, Genesis House, Winkler Day Care, Pembina Valley Pregnancy Care Centre, Anxiety Disorder Association of Manitoba and South Central Cancer Research.






