Domains & Indicators of Community Well-being

This report is organized into eight domains of well-being, representing different aspects of community life. Each domain contains locally-relevant indicators that reflect or influence well-being. This approach, inspired by the Canadian Index of Wellbeing approach, assesses and measures indicators across all areas of community life.

Data Collection

Guided by a dedicated volunteer committee and local community leaders, roundtable workshops were held to identify "what matters" to the community and shape the focus of data collection and survey development.

Community and youth surveys were conducted in May and June 2024, both online and at various community locations.

After compiling the survey results and other datasets, community members participated in focus groups to reflect on the findings.

Secondary Data Sources: Information from federal and provincial sources such as Statistics Canada's 2021 Census, provincial statistics, municipal reports and records, and other local sources.

Agriculture & Soil Conservation

By 2021, 63% of Stanley's farmland used conservation tillage (MB 71%), doubling in size since 2011. This practice reduces soil disturbance and retains plant material, improving soil health.

Energy Efficiency

Efficiency Manitoba supported 428 projects in Winkler homes and businesses from 2020 to 2024.

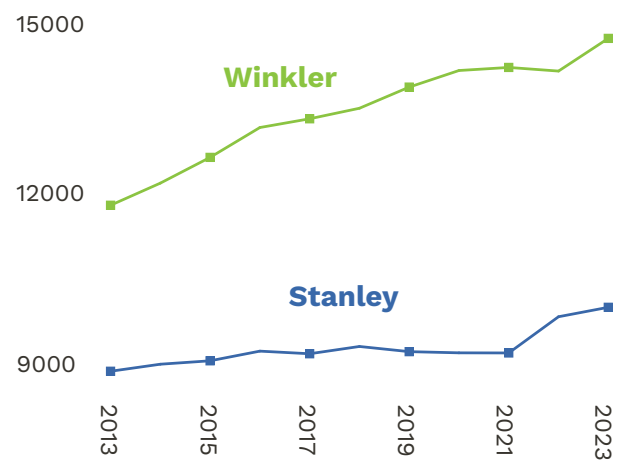
Environment

Population

Winkler & Stanley, 2013-2023

In 2023, Winkler's population grew to 14,692 people, 25% higher than 10 years before. Stanley's population grew to 9,962, 13% higher than in 2013. Over the same period, Manitoba grew by 15% and Canada grew by 14%.



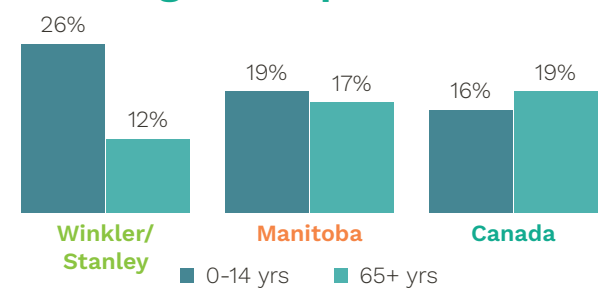

Youngest & Oldest Age Groups, 2021



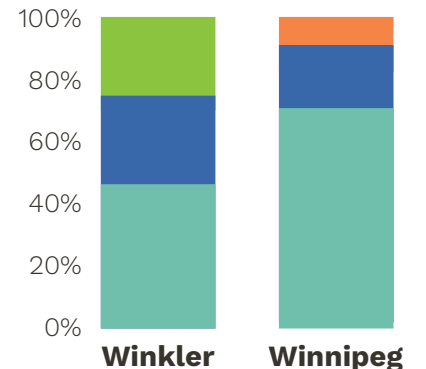
DID YOU KNOW?

Waste, Composting & Recycling

The RM of Stanley has 1553 residences with recycling bins, primarily in Reinfeld and Schanzenfeld.

In 2023, Winkler diverted 54% of city waste away from the landfill with recycling and composting. Winnipeg diverted less than 30%.

Working Together

The RM of Stanley is partnering with Winkler on a joint wastewater treatment project that will provide capacity for the area for many years to come.



Community Resilience

The community's ability to withstand challenges and prosper, with a focus on access to services, a robust local economy and job market, public safety and transportation infrastructure.

WCF @ Work:
Youth in Philanthropy (YIP), a Foundation initiative held at our local high and junior high schools, empowers young people to lead community change by learning about local charities, engaging in community activities, and financially supporting projects that are important to youth.

Businesses per Capita, 2024
In June 2024, there were 181 businesses with employees in Stanley, and 773 in Winkler. When compared to the working age population, Winkler has 75% more businesses, per capita, than Manitoba.

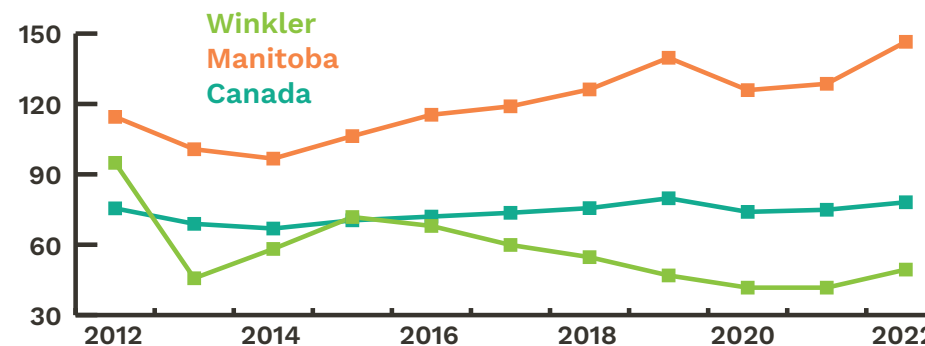

The City of Winkler is exploring service providers for a new public transportation pilot project, based on insights from their 2023 Transportation Feasibility Study.



Education & Learning

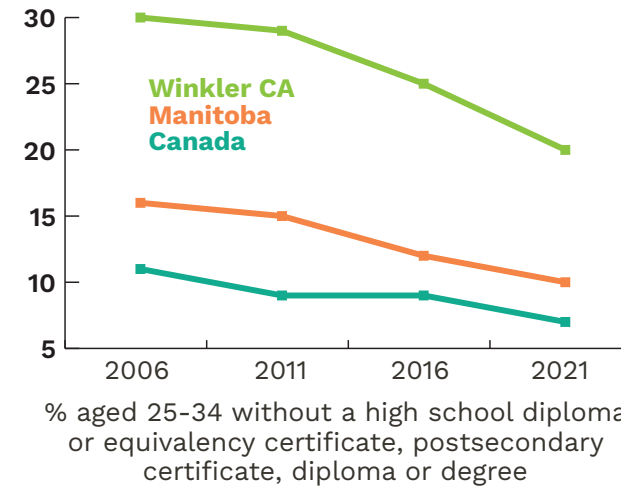

High School Graduation Rate



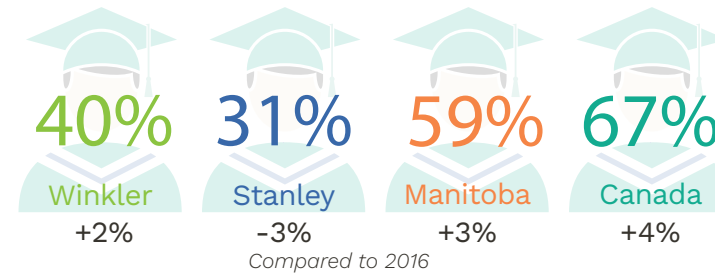

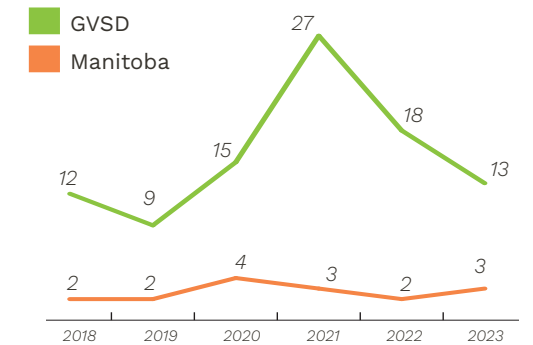

WCF @ Work:

As a result of the 2018 Vital Signs report, the Mend the Gap Fund was created. This fund supports initiatives, programs and services that alleviate poverty through innovative approaches impacting families and making a difference by Mending the Gap in the community of Winkler.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Food Cupboard's spending on food increased from \$112,729 in 2018 to \$288,679 in 2023. The average number of households served per week by the Food Cupboard rose from 63 in October 2020 to 143 in October 2023.

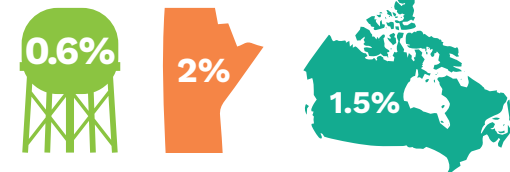

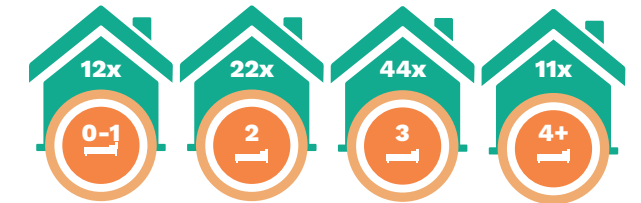

Health & Wellness

Reflects the physical and mental health of community members, and aspects of the local health care system, including access to healthcare, home care and long-term care.

WCF @ Work:
WCF granted \$162,382 to health-related projects from 2019-2024. The Dr. C.W. Wiebe Medical Fund, which supports medical equipment purchases in Winkler and the surrounding area, contributed \$50,000 to the MRI centre at Boundary Trails and has funded numerous projects at the C.W. Wiebe Medical Centre over the years.

DID YOU KNOW?

Boundary Trails Health Centre is expanding, with new inpatient beds, an enhanced Cancer Care unit, and an echocardiography suite set to be completed by 2027.

COMMUNITY REFLECTION

Homecare Services

In July, 2024, the local home care program had 310 clients. From April 2023-Mar 2024, 212 new clients were admitted to Home Care in Winkler. This is 19% higher than the number of new clients in 2018-19.

Health Data Sources: Manitoba's major health reports are published every five years, with the next round of Community Health Assessments expected in Fall/Winter 2024/25, to be available on the Southern Health - Santé Sud website.

Satisfaction with Health Care System

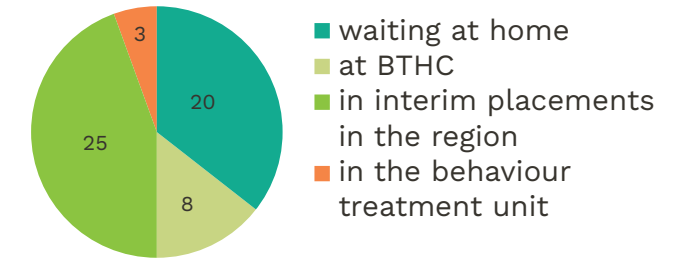
The 2024 community survey highlighted a common paradox between access and quality of care in Canada:

- Highest Satisfaction: Care from family doctors and primary care providers.
- Lowest Satisfaction: Walk-in/clinic availability, particularly during evenings and weekends.

Physicians & Surgeons in Winkler

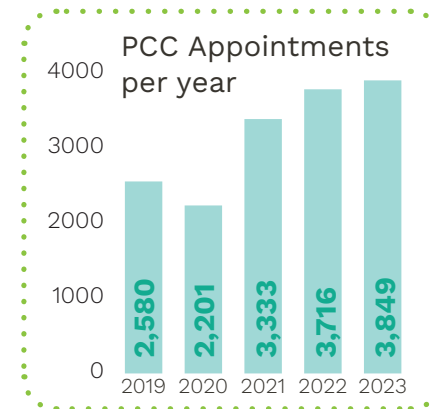
- In 2024, the C.W. Wiebe Medical Centre had 43 physicians, including 30 primary care doctors and 13 specialists.
- To meet the primary care needs of the area, the Centre estimates a need for 10 more physicians.
- In 2024, 67% of Winkler's surgeons were women, which is nearly double the provincial and national averages.

WCF @ Work:
The Winkler Heritage Museum Fund supports the Winkler Heritage Museum's operating costs. This museum exists to preserve and exhibit local history.

DID YOU KNOW?

With the support of Regional Connections, the 2024 Vital Signs Community Survey was offered with translations in Arabic, German, Russian, Spanish and Ukrainian.

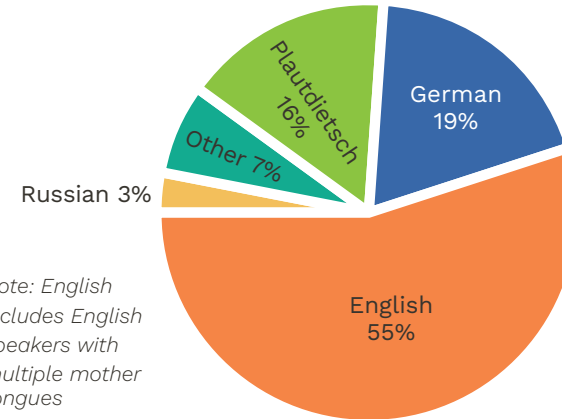

In 2021, 46% of immigrants living in Winkler/Stanley immigrated when they were under 15 years old.

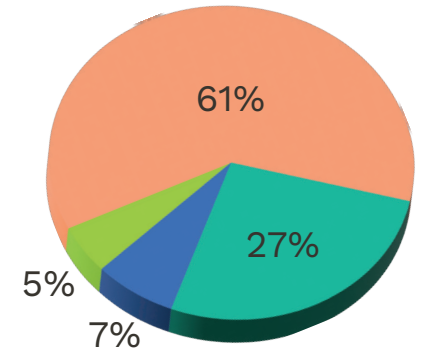


Languages: Mother Tongue

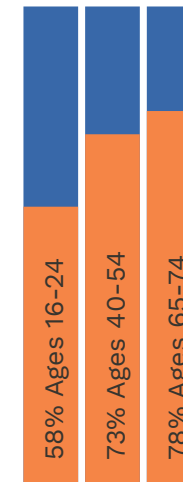

We asked: Are you an active member of a local cultural, faith or community group? How often do you participate?

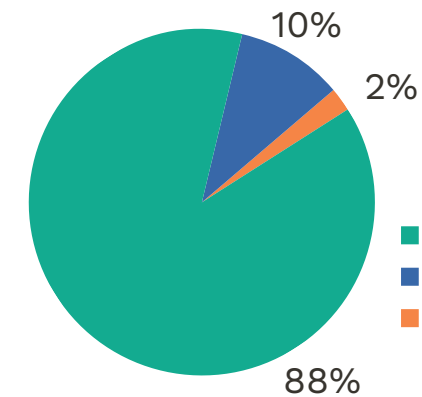

The Evan Thomas Memorial Fund supports youth who might otherwise be unable to afford playing hockey, by covering their hockey registration fees. Families can apply through the Winkler Minor Hockey Association.

DID YOU KNOW?

- In 2023, the Bernhard Thiessen Hall & Fieldhouse Turf facility was reserved for 1,449 hours.
- The facility is used year-round for sports training, indoor leagues, competitions, special events, and private bookings, including birthday parties.

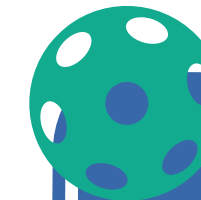

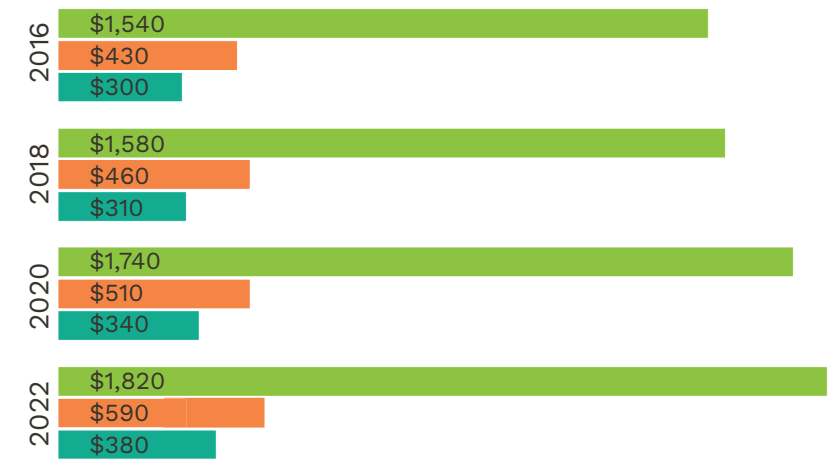

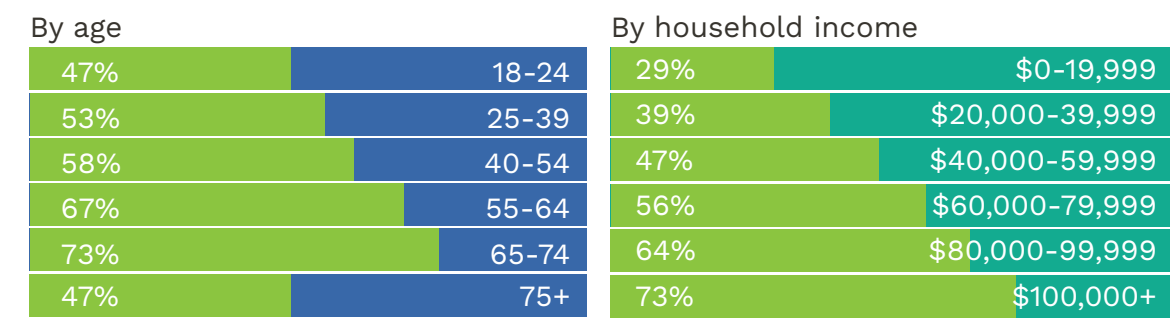
Winkler has the second highest median donation amount in Canada.



In 2022, Steinbach (\$2,230) and Winkler (\$1,820) remained Canada's most charitable urban centres of 10,000 or more people in 2022. Manitoba (\$590) was Canada's most charitable province.

This report presents information organized into eight domains of well-being, representing different aspects of community life. Each domain contains carefully selected indicators that reflect or influence well-being.

Grade Scores

Each domain is scored on a scale from 1 (F) to 5 (A+), based on:

- 80%: Key indicator scores, evaluated against provincial or national benchmarks, and adjusted for recent trends.
- 20%: 2024 Community survey satisfaction scores.

Grades in this report combine both indicator performance and community survey satisfaction scores. This approach differs from the 2018 report, where grades were based solely on satisfaction scores. For more detailed information, please refer to the 2024 Vital Signs Enhanced Report.
